



Claudia is a single mother of two who was on unpaid medical leave, but once she returned to work, she was let go without cause. After losing her job, Claudia was struggling to pay her rent and utilities as well as feed her family, which is when Community Assistance Center (CAC) came into her life. Overwhelmed, Claudia CAC, Claudia also received came to CAC and with tears in her eyes, she began pulling past due bills and documentation from her purse as shared her story with a CAC Case Manager. Her Case Manager provided a listening ear along with support and guidance on setting a formal appointment to receive assistance. When Claudia returned for her appointment, she shared how much she appreciated being listened to and encouraged.

Claudia met with volunteers with CAC's faith partner April Sound Church to receive assistance with her utility bills. Claudia shared with her CAC Case Manager that she was going to have an upcoming job interview with another CAC collaborative community partner. Before leaving clothing from the Unique Resale in preparation for her job interview and food for the family from CAC's Client Choice Food Pantry. A few days later, Claudia emailed her Case Manager to share the news that she was offered the job and was awaiting the official offer letter, getting her and her family back on their feet and on the road to self-sufficiency.




